While at the Simplot Food Group, she helped to lead critical system implementation efforts. Her keen insight and level-headed approach to business earned her the respect and friendship of many. After retiring, Miren immersed herself in the activities of her lifelong Boise church, Our Lady of the Rosary, where she attended daily Mass and volunteered weekly. She also volunteered weekly at the St. Vincent de Paul food pantry in Boise.
